Alisha Vang, a freshman at Multnomah School of the Bible in Portland, has been called to take part in a mission trip to Rwanda. Looking for a way to serve God outside her country, along with her student body, she has taken on the task to collect books and create a library for Rwanda Evangelical School of Theology that is opening in January of 2011. While the mission team is in the capital city of Kigali, they will be sharing the gospel with street kids, teaching and leading worship in churches, going into orphanages, and reaching out to people who are seeking God. It has been a passion of hers to go into the mission field.

Rwanda, still known for its 1994 genocide in which an estimated 800,000 people were killed, has recovered and is now considered a model nation for developing countries. The government is widely seen as one of the most efficient and honest ones in Africa. The capital city, Kigali, is known for its cleanliness and security. God has been working in Rwanda during the last fifteen years.

Alisha, an education major, is one of five children, the daughter of Nhia and Thai Vang. Her parents came to the United States as refugees from the mountains of Laos in 1988 after spending seven years in a camp in Thailand. The Vang family attends the Portland Hmong Alliance Church.
